9/3/2015 8:00 PM Officer responded to a domestic altercation at the 700 block of Pearl. The altercation was verbal in nature and both agreed to cohabitate for the remainder of the evening.

9/13/2015 9:50 PM Officer took a theft report at the storage units on 3rd and River. The unit was shared by several customers who had terminated their contract with the business months prior. What was left behind and still in the unit was the reporting party's property.

9/25/2015 8:43 PM Officer received a call of a heavily intoxicated male causing a disturbance at the 300 block of Vine. A 43 year old Ames man was arrested for Public Intoxication and transported to the Story County Jail in Nevada.

9/26/2015 9:29 PM Officer responded to the 300 block of Water Street for a male who was involved in a fight and needed to be removed from a business. A 42 year old Cambridge man was arrested for Assault on an Officer, Interference with Official Acts, Public Intoxication, and Disorderly Conduct. He was transported to the Story County Jail in Nevada. The Officer was transported to the hospital for his injuries.

Huxley Officers had five arrests for the month. Two were for Public Intoxication, one for Disorderly Conduct, one for Interference with Official Acts, and one for Assault on a Peace Officer. Officers issued two citations for traffic offenses and gave two warnings. Officers received 39 calls for service and had a total of 78 contacts for the month. Officers gave 12.5 hours toward investigations, providing assistance, or answering calls and gave 88.25 hours of general patrol
