Monthly Report

1/3/2015 6:10 PM Officer took a report of a car vs. deer accident that took place on Highway 69 north of the Kelley turnoff. A vehicle operated by an Indianola man struck a deer causing approximately \$1000 in damage. No injuries.

1/5/2015 2:30 PM Officer was called to the 106 Mile Marker of Interstate 35 southbound for a two vehicle accident. A Northfield, Minnesota man struck a semi causing approximately \$800 in damage. No injuries.

1/7/2015 7:32 PM Officer was called to a business at the 900 block of Highway 69 for a man who was harassing employees and customers. A 36 year old Huxley man was arrested for Public Intoxication and transported to the Story County Jail in Nevada.

1/8/2015 7:57 AM Officer took a report of a two vehicle accident at a parking lot located at the 100 block of Highway 69. A vehicle operated by a 53 year old Huxley woman had struck a parked vehicle owned by another Huxley woman causing approximately \$2500 in damage. No injuries.

1/18/2015 9:15 AM Officer took a report of harassment by text message from a Cambridge juvenile and parents. Contact was made with other Ballard students who agreed to stop the harassing behavior in order to avoid future police attention.

1/20/2015 8:00 AM Officer responded to a two vehicle accident at the 500 block of 5<sup>th</sup> Ave. A vehicle operated by a Huxley student was struck from behind by a vehicle operated by a Cambridge student causing \$350 in damage. No injuries.

1/22/2015 6:38 AM Officer discovered a storage unit had been broken into at the 500 block of E 1<sup>st</sup>. Contact was made with the owners who advised that no items had been taken.

1/22/2015 2:30 PM Officer stopped a vehicle for a traffic violation at the intersection of 1<sup>st</sup> and Main. The driver of the vehicle, a 48 year old Huxley woman, was suspended from driving. She was cited and released with a court date.

1/24/2015 10:00 PM Officer took a report of a domestic altercation that took place at the 500 block of E 1<sup>st</sup> Street. The altercation was not physical and both parties remained separate for the night.

1/25/2015 1:50 AM Officer was called to the 1100 block of Northview to take a report of a possible suicidal subject. A broadcast was put out for all area officers to attempt to locate the individual. The subject was located in Boone that morning and was fine.

1/25/2015 3:13 AM Officer stopped a vehicle for a traffic violation on Highway 69 near E 5<sup>th</sup> Street. The driver of the vehicle, a 30 year old Des Moines man, was arrested for OWI and transported to the Story County Jail in Nevada.

1/25/2015 10:00 AM Officer responded to a domestic altercation at the 500 block of E 1<sup>st</sup> Street. The altercation was verbal in nature and both parties agreed to remain separated for the remainder of the day.

1/26/2015 5:16 PM Officer stopped a vehicle for a traffic violation on E 1<sup>st</sup> Street near Sandcherry. The driver of the vehicle, a 35 year old Huxley man, was suspended from driving. He was cited and released for Driving While License Suspended.

1/30/2015 8:30 PM Officer responded to a domestic altercation at the 100 block of North 2<sup>nd</sup> Ave. The altercation was verbal in nature and both parties agreed that they could cohabitate for the remainder of the night with no further problems.

Huxley officers had four arrests for the month. Two were for Driving While License Suspended, and one was for Public Intoxication, and one for OWI. Officers issued 13 citations for traffic offenses and gave 49 warnings. Officers received 164 calls for service or information and had a total of 339 contacts for the month. Officers had 251 hours for investigations, providing service, or taking calls and gave 433.5 hours of general patrol.
