Monthly Report

5/4/2015 8:04 AM Officer responded to a motor vehicle accident at the Ballard High School parking lot. A vehicle operated by a Ballard student struck a parked vehicle causing approximately \$250 in damage. No injuries.

5/4/2015 12:47 PM Officer responded to the Ballard Middle School for a report of a fight. Two Ballard Students were referred into Juvenile Court. One was referred for Disorderly Conduct and Assault, the other for Disorderly Conduct.

5/4/2015 1:32 PM Officer responded to the Ballard High School for a report of a student who was out of control. The officer was able to assist Ballard staff and transport the juvenile student to his father.

5/4/2015 2:52 PM Officer took a report of harassment at the 100 block of National Drive. Contact was made with a 21 year old Huxley man who agreed to stop the behavior in order to avoid future police attention.

5/6/2015 5:00 PM Officer stopped a vehicle for a traffic violation on East 1st near Sandcherry. The driver of the vehicle, a 39 year old Nevada man, was barred from driving. He was arrested for Driving While Barred and transported to the Story County Jail in Nevada.

5/9/2015 2:30 AM Officer responded to a single vehicle accident on 560th near Sandcherry. A vehicle operated by a 27 year old Huxley woman lost control on the gravel road and was stuck in a steep ditch. No injuries.

5/12/2015 12:45 PM Officer received a complaint of Credit Card Fraud from a Huxley resident. His credit card was used at a Walgreens in Des Moines to make purchases in April. The card had never been missing and was still in the victim's possession. Surveillance footage was gathered from the Walgreens and the suspect who made the purchase was caught on camera.

The victim does not recognize the suspect. The images were sent to several Law Enforcement Intelligence Networks in order to gain a positive identification on the suspect. Ongoing.

5/13/2015 5:06 PM Officer stopped a vehicle for a traffic violation at East 1st and Parkridge. The driver of the vehicle, a 36 year old Cambridge man, was suspended from driving. He was cited and released with a court date for Driving Under Suspension.

5/19/2015 10:15 PM Officer was asked to check the welfare of a Huxley resident at the 100 block of Oak Blvd. Contact was made with the 59 year old woman who was transported to Mary Greeley for treatment.

5/22/2015 8:05 PM Officer responded to the 100 block of National Drive for a harassment complaint. Contact was made with a 32 year old Des Moines man. He was advised to stop the behavior in order to avoid future police attention.

5/31/2015 4:56 PM Officer responded to a hit and run accident. A Huxley resident's vehicle had been struck sometime in the past few days possibly while parked at school but it is unknown for certain of when or where.

5/31/2015 11:00 PM Officer took a harassment complaint at the 100 block of Oak Blvd. Contact was made with a Newton woman who agreed to stop the harassing behavior in order to avoid future police attention.

Huxley Officers had five arrests for the month. Two were for Disorderly Conduct, one was for Assault, one was for Driving While Barred, and one for Driving While Suspended. Officers issued 36 citations for traffic offenses and gave 74 warnings. Officer received 163 calls for service or information and had a total of 452 contacts for the month. Officers used 256.25 hours toward investigations, answering questions, or providing assistance and provided 458 hours of general patrol.
