Monthly Report for the City of Huxley
September 2018

Sept 3rd, 2018 8:04 PM Officer responded to a domestic altercation at the 500 block of 4th Street. The altercation was verbal and both parties agreed that they could cohabitate for the remainder of the night with no further problems.

Sept 4th, 2018 4:03 PM Officer received a harassment complaint from a citizen at the 500 block of 5th Street. The source of the harassment was online on snapchat.

Sept 7th, 2018 6:35 PM Officer stopped a vehicle for a traffic violation on Highway 69 near 1st Street. The driver of the vehicle, a 24 year old Pleasant Hill man, was suspended from driving. He was cited and released with a court date for Driving Under Suspension.

Sept 10th, 2018 2:30 PM Officer was contacted by Ballard faculty to check the welfare of a student. Contact was made with the student who agreed to go to the hospital for treatment.

Sept 10th, 2018 11:51 AM Officer received a theft complaint at the 200 block of Oak Blvd. Property belonging to a Huxley woman was left in the care of her aunt and mother while she was in prison. Upon her return from prison, several items were missing. Ongoing.

Sept 12th, 2018 2:00 PM Officer responded to a two vehicle accident at the 400 block of West Centennial. A vehicle operated by a Slater man was struck by a vehicle operated by a Kelly woman causing approximately \$1500 in damage to each vehicle. No injuries.

Sept 12th 2018 2:20 PM Officer responded to a two vehicle accident in the Ballard Plaza. A vehicle operated by an Ames man struck a vehicle operated by an Ankeny woman while backing out of a parking spot causing over \$1500 in damage to both vehicles. No injuries.

Sept 14th, 2018 8:00 PM Officer cited and released a 40 year old Huxley woman for False reports to public safety entities at the 300 block of 1st Street.

Sept 14th, 2018 7:56 AM Officer responded to an accident at the 100 block of Lynwood. A vehicle operated by a Huxley student struck a parked car causing approximately \$750 damage to each vehicle. No injuries.

Sept 14th, 2018 10:24 PM Officer stopped a vehicle at the 100 Mile Marker of Interstate 35 near the rest area for a traffic violation. The driver of the vehicle, a 19 year old San Antonio, TX man, was cited and released for an .02 alcohol violation.

Sept 15th, 2018 5:05 PM Officer responded to an altercation at the 300 block of 1st Street. A juvenile female was taken to Rosedale in Ames on a parental placement.

Sept 17th, 2018 7:15 PM Officer responded to a two vehicle accident on Highway 69 near Main. A vehicle operated by a Huxley driver rear ended a vehicle operated by another Huxley driver. There were no injuries.

Sept 18th, 2018 9:45 AM Officer was called to the Ballard Middle School to assist with an out of control student. Officer assisted Ballard faculty until no longer needed.

Sept 18th, 2018 7:35 AM Officer responded to a two vehicle accident at the 100 block of National Drive. A vehicle backing out of a parking spot failed to see a vehicle already travelling in the parking lot and collided with it. The damage to both vehicles total approximately \$3000.

Sept 19th, 2018 11:45 AM Officer responded to a domestic altercation at the 300 block of 1st Street. Both parties agreed to remain separated for the remainder of the day and the male half elected to get a ride to Ames while the female remained behind at the residence.

Sept 20th, 2018 7:05 PM Officer served an arrest warrant at the 100 block of National Drive. A 23 year old Huxley man was transported to the Story County Jail in Nevada.

Sept 20th, 2018 4:20 PM Officer received a harassment complaint at the 500 block of E 4th. Mutual harassment by neighbors over the matter of money was the finding of the responding officer. Both parties were advised to settle their differences in small claims court and to quit the harassing behavior.

Sept 24th, 2018 5:02 PM Officer stopped a vehicle for a traffic violation on Oak Blvd near Highway 69. The driver of the vehicle, a 29 year old Huxley man, was suspended from driving. He was cited and released with a court date for Driving While License Suspended.

Sept 25th, 2018 3:12 PM Officer responded to an accident in the Ballard High School parking lot. A vehicle operated by a Cambridge student struck a parked vehicle causing approximately \$1000 in damage.

Sept 26th, 2018 2:10 PM Officer responded to a two vehicle accident in the Ballard High School parking lot. A vehicle operated by Huxley student was struck by another Huxley student causing approximately \$2000 in total damage.

Sept 26th, 2018 9:32 PM Officer stopped a vehicle for a traffic violation on Highway 69 near Highway 210. The driver of the vehicle, a 23 year old Huxley man, was suspended from driving. He was cited and released with a court date for Driving While License Suspended.

Special Assignments / Training

- Sept 7th Officer was assigned to the Ballard Football game
- Sept 10th and 11th an officer attended to two day training in West Des Moines and is now certified to give one-on-one counseling to PD and Fire staff. The training came at no cost to the City.
- Sept 12th and 13th. Officers assisted with ALICE (active shooter) training with the Ballard Middle School faculty and student body.
- Sept 12th and the 19th. All officer re-certified with their duty handguns, duty rifles, duty shotguns, and off duty handguns as required yearly.
- Sept 15th. Officer was assisted ISU Police with football game day security.
- Sept 18th and 19th. Officer received FEMA Incident Command Training. This training was held in Nevada and was at no cost to the city.
- Sept 20th. The Ballard Homecoming parade was led by officer as requested by Ballard Schools.
- Sept 21. Officer was assigned to Ballard the Ballard Football game for security.
- Sept 22nd. Officer was assigned to the Ballard High School Homecoming dance at the request of Ballard Schools.
- Sept 27th. Officer assisted the Ballard Middle School with their Tornado drill.

Huxley Officers had five arrests for the month. Three were for Driving Under Suspension, one was for False Reports to Law Enforcement, and one was an Alcohol .02 Violation. Officers issued twenty three citations for traffic violations and gave eighty five warnings. Officers received 152 calls for service and had 410 contacts for the month. Officers used 272.25 hours toward investigations or answering calls for service and gave 565 hours of general patrol.
