Huxley Police Department
Monthly Report for September 2019

September 2nd, 2019 3:11 AM Officer responded to a domestic altercation at the 200 block of N 3rd. The altercation was physical and the suspect, a 24-year-old Des Moines man, was arrested for Aggravated Domestic Assault and Driving While Barred. He was taken to the Story County Jail in Nevada.

September 2nd, 2019 8:00 AM Officer received a complaint of a male trespassing in several businesses and apartment complexes by going through the dumpsters and creating a mess. Contact was made with the 44-year-old Huxley man who was advised to stop the behavior to avoid future police attention.

September 2nd, 2019 3:30 PM Officer received a complaint of animal neglect at the 500 block of E 1st. A resident had recently been taken to the hospital and nobody was arranged to take care of several animals. The animals were taken to the Boone County ARL for care.
